The Village Conference

The Tenants and Residents Association would like to thank the fifty residents who attended the Conference.

Speakers were well received, interesting and informative.

Emily Kenward spoke about her Time to Talk Befriending charity, its partners, and about its inception and how it operates, which includes to a great extent befriending elderly residents in Woodingdean.

The Chairman of Woodingdean's Neighbourhood Watch, JP Amos, followed with an explanation of the new 'No Cold Calling Zone' which has been organised for Woodingdean residents, and the progress and growth of membership achieved by the Neighbourhood Watch team since its inception in late 2014.

Eddie Cope then spoke about help to be given to Council Tenants.

After a break for complimentary tea, coffee and biscuits, our two Councillors, Dee Simson and Steve Bell, enlightened the audience with news and updates on the Vodafone mast and results of the traffic deputation to the various Council committees and subsequent communications with them.

The Conference ended at 1pm.

Traffic Deputations

Since the last newsletter, a deputation was made to a full Brighton & Hove City Council meeting in July, to ask the following question:

"Who, or which Councillor, or what Committee has changed the planning consent, made by the Council Planners in 2012, to give acceptance to Laing O'Rourke and 3TS development company to re-route commercial vehicles through Woodingdean, to and from the building hub at the old gas works, without any public knowledge or consultation, prior to April 2016, with Woodingdean residents or Councillors, when it clearly states in 2012 that the A23, A27 and A270 should be used, in the consent for the work to go ahead.

If nobody has changed the application, what 'rights to change planning decisions' have you given Laing O'Rourke and 3TS to route traffic through the already blocked roads of Woodingdean Village?

Also, if the Council only knew in April 2016, who gave permission to Laing O'Rourke to have a map agreed and published, clearly showing the traffic flow and vehicle numbers, already copy-written before our public meeting in June?"

'Answer came there none'.

So the question was asked again by JP Amos at the next meeting of the Transport and Sustainability Committee, which followed in early October. 'Answer came there none'.

So, in October the Committee then wrote to the Chairman of Brighton & Hove City Council to answer the question.

Answer: "The Council is not required to re-consult or advise planning application consultees, including the Police, of any changes, unless legislation or policy requires another planning application to be submitted."

Feedback from our Local Councillors

t is always a privilege for us to represent such a great place as Woodingdean, and support the residents on a day to day basis.

Since our last update to you all, we have wondered if you have noticed the resurfacing work carried out in Warren Road, pot holes repaired in Cowley Drive, Bexhill Road and Crescent Drive South?

Yes, still many more roads need attention, but we are working to have these repaired as well.

This is an area of great concern to us all and we will continue to ensure all potholes are brought to the Council's attention.

We are continuing to stand up to the Council to ensure the protection of the grass areas such as in front of the Lawn Memorial Park.

We have also been able to have maps made for the nature walks in Happy Valley.

We have been told that all the roads have been sprayed with weed killer during the past weeks and that we should have seen the difference. Neither of us believe this has been carried out effectively, and would really like to know your views on this by email please, so we can inform the Council.

We lobbied the Council at the last Full Council meeting to have free parking in the Council-owned car parks during December, so our residents could enjoy the City Centre Christmas shopping and attractions, but sadly the Council 'Grinches' wouldn't agree.

The two biggest issues for us all in Woodingdean at the moment are the serious increase in traffic from the new hospital development and the Vodafone mobile phone mast in Warren Road.

We have met many times with Council Officers on both issues, attended public meetings and taken part in a demonstration to ensure that the Council know the disgust that the residents feel about being treated in this way by the Council.

Both of these have become serious issues to us in the village, due to the poor administration of the Council. Members of the Tenants & Residents Association have made a deputation and representation at both Full Council and Environment Transport and Sustainability Committee meetings.

We will both continue to work with the residents, various committees and groups in Woodingdean to keep lobbying the Council on your behalf with these matters.

Woodingdean's new defibrillator

Our Village now has the benefit of three defibrillators.

One is in the Methodist Church, the second at the Bowls Club and now the third, for everybody's use and which is available 24/7, is installed outside the entrance of the Community Centre, to the right hand side.

Instructions are inside the machine, which starts immediately when the front is opened. No specific training is needed as a voice will take you through the stages. It tells you how to put the two pads on, and how to operate it.

The machine will be an excellent addition to help anyone in need of it, and will help greatly in the vital few minutes before a paramedic team arrives.

The Tenants and Residents Association are indebted to Tim Fellows, Unit Operating Manager of South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust, for organising the unit.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme



Woodingdean has seen many "No Cold Calling Zone" signs put up recently, financed by the Neighbourhood Watch team.

There are window stickers available from Neighbourhood Watch Street Contacts,

for a donation of £1, that give telephone numbers to report callers, who either have no intention of acknowledging the window stickers, or return after being asked not to, or callers who will just not go away.

Giving information to the Police about unwanted rogue traders will help us all and build up a good picture of unscrupulous selling, so that resources can be directed to Woodingdean by the Police and Trading Standards, when needed.

We all know now that Police cover is limited, with costcutting and fewer officers on the beat, so we must help the Police – to help ourselves.

It is not an offence to call at a house in the first place, but how the call is made, persistence in pushing a product or scheme to the resident, can create the offence.

Equally it may help to stop the bus loads of cold calling charity 'persuaders' who are dropped off in the morning and collected at night, who aren't selling anything, but just asking for a monthly standing order from which they get their commission, which are equally as bad.

Now that Winter is coming, with its dark nights, ensure you lock back doors and windows and if two people call and only one is in your eyesight you may become subject to a distraction burglary if you don't have your wits about you.




